Prejudice and presumptions about the black community were a major setback. They were too poor to buy any books for their children. Booker T Washington had the financial value for the family, it was difficult for him to attend the regular school. Therefore in order to overcome this difficulties, he had to work in the salt furnace till 9 O'clock and go to school. Describe Booker T Washington's initial struggle to learn to read. It didn't lead to a recurring holiday, but it signaled a desire for such a celebration. The introduction of education was a step in the direction of advancement. Woodrow Wilson supported the holiday when he learned of it and even took part in the festivities remotely in 1916, but unlike with Mother's Day, Congress was not willing to endorse it. The culture was like that that the people in the new surroundings were all colored people who often quarreled and fought.
